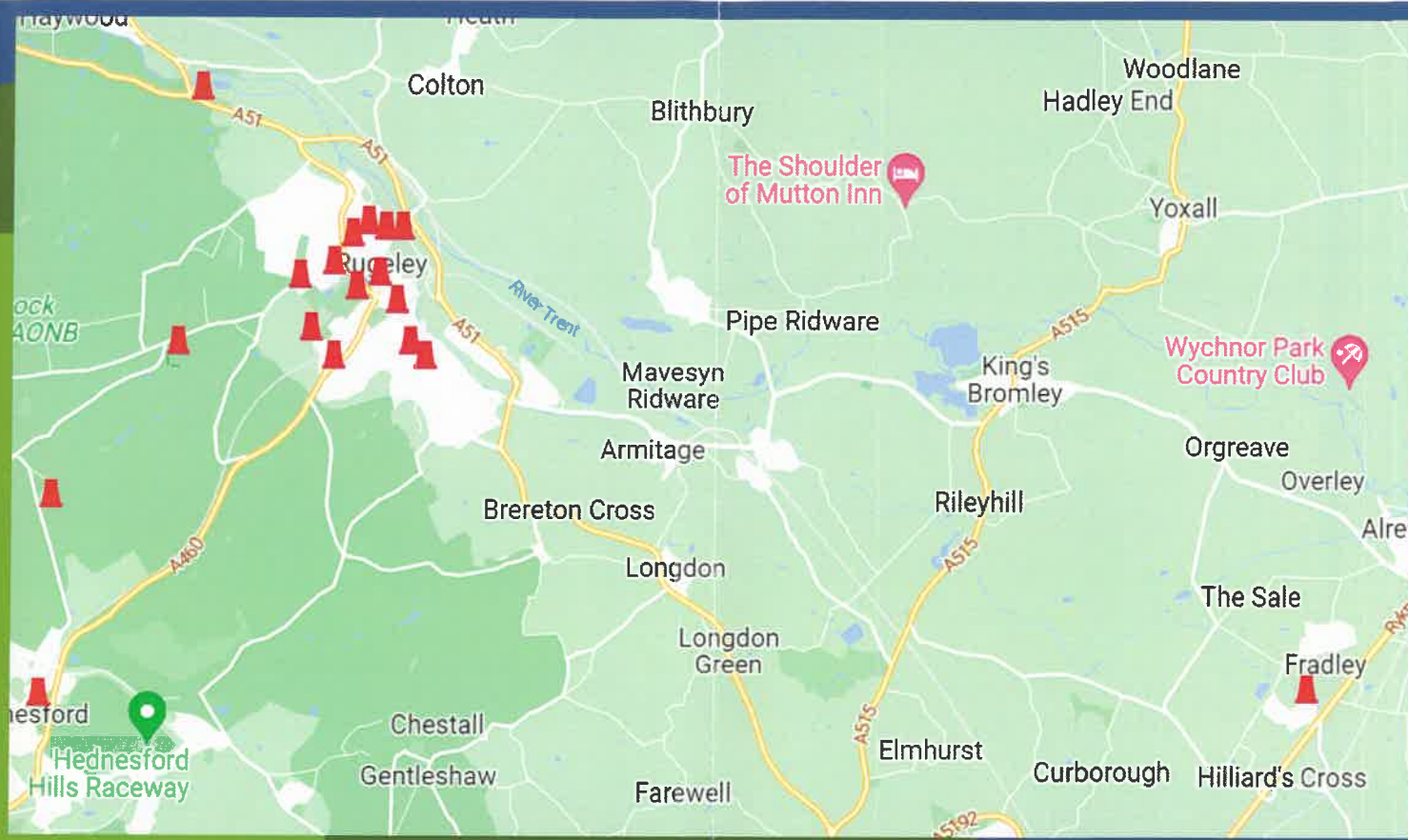

The Energy Arts Project is an initiative created by Rugeley Town Council, in celebration of our historic cooling towers, which were such an important part of Rugeley's history.

During the course of 2022, we created 12 replica cooling towers which were 3D printed using recycled sugar cane pulp. We commissioned a local artist, along with A Level art students from The Hart School, Rugeley and young people from Visions Youth Service, to decorate them with meaningful local scenes.

The results are truly wonderful, depicting many historical events and periods through Rugeley's rich history.

The towers are now in their temporary homes around the local area for all to see.
