Dear Mrs Goodreid

The CCGs submitted Section 106 funding applications along with a business case to both Cannock Chase and Lichfield District Councils in relation to the Rugeley Power Station development to secure funding for primary care services in Rugeley.

The business case outlined options for developing our current primary care estate by exploring options to extend surgeries in Rugeley to provide additional clinical room capacity. The option to have a new GP surgery on the development was explored, however, the GP surgeries in Rugeley felt that their current estate could be best utilised if funding was made available.

The CCGs have been successful in securing Section 106 funding from Cannock Chase District Council. We have not yet confirmed how the funding will be utilised, however our next steps will be to engage with all GP practices in Rugeley and review current estate capacity, exploring where there are opportunities to create the additional space, such as possible extensions to the existing buildings. The CCGs are committed to supporting practices. For example, the Horsefair Practice Group submitted a GP Premises Improvement Grant application in November 2020 to secure funding to create four additional clinical rooms at the Springfields Health and Wellbeing Centre to support with the future increase of patients from the Rugeley Power Station development. The application was approved by the CCGs and the practice finished the works in April 2021.

We understand that access to GP practices is an issue at present due to busy telephone lines and high demand for appointments. Please be assured that we are working closely with practices in Rugeley on access and providing them with guidance and training opportunities.

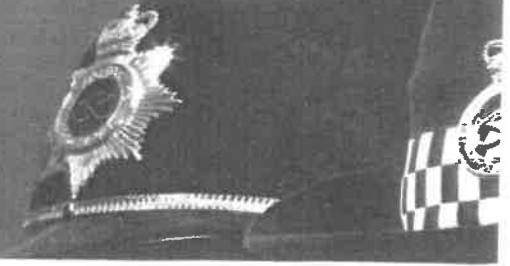

Firstly can I send apologies for the non-attendance of an officer.

Incidents of note

During the last month we have had the below incidents reported.

ASB. 11 incidents reported. These numbers are slightly higher than those recorded during July. This coincides with the summer holidays. We have also experienced a rise in the number of young persons in Rugeley Town Centre, during this period, going to and from 'The Den' in Brewery Street Rugeley. None of the recorded ASB incidents could be attributed to 'The Den'. The incidents reported included young person's cycling their bikes through Tesco store, and also young person's climbing onto the roofs of local town centre premises.

CONCERNS FOR SAFETY. 9 incidents recorded. These include some of the ASB incidents above involving people climbing over the town centre roofs. Also included in this are 'Banking Protocol' incidents. These are concerns shown by local banks, when mainly elderly or vulnerable customers try to withdraw/transfer large sums of money to bank accounts abroad, raising suspicions that they are being extorted.

PUBLIC ORDER/VIOLENCE. There have been 13 such incidents in the month. A high proportion of these have resulted from incidents in local licensed premises, late at night.

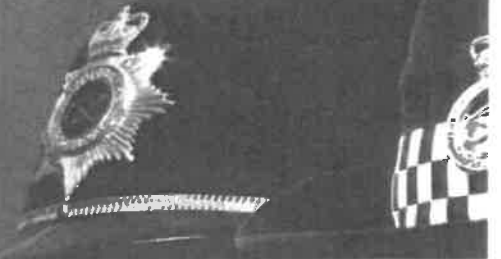
THEFT. 3 incidents of shoplifting recorded. One offender detained and property value nearing £500.00 recovered. Again the offenders committing such crime are travelling to the area from the West Midlands (Walsall/Willenhall). They are frequently using the rail network to travel to Rugeley.

THEFT OTHER. 6 incidents recorded. These include theft of planters from outside a local address and also theft of mobile phones from licensed premises.

ROAD TRAFFIC COLLISIONS. 4 recorded.

Going forward we have a meeting arranged alongside the Town, County and District Councils to try and address the issues. This meeting is due to take place on Tuesday 14th September 2021.
